April Program and Workshop

Our April speaker will be Karen Tunnell from Atlanta, GA. Lecture - April 10th and class on April 11th.

She will be doing a trunk show at our meeting and will be doing a workshop on Friday, April 11th from 9:30 - 4 on Kaleidoscope Piecing. She will be taking Paula Nadelstern's techniques and expanding on the ideas to incorporate surface design techniques. You'll learn lots of tricks for creating amazing things with simple techniques which she will demonstrate. Kaleidoscope piecing is a great way to examine color, pattern and design. Everyone should get a good start on one kaleidoscope block which can be framed, quilted or incorporated into larger pieces. She will be providing the fabrics for the class for a \$10.00 fee, and will bring more than enough.

There is a \$10.00 kit fee payable to the instructor and she will also be selling hand marbled fabrics for \$5.00 and up.

Upcoming Meeting and Workshop Information

May meeting - May 8th

Pat Morris will be our guest speaker for the meeting. She will be talking about AARP and the many programs they offer for our senior members of the guild. Pat has been a representative of AARP for some time and speaks at different functions providing important information and will answer any questions regarding the programs that are available.

There is no workshop for the month of May.

June meeting - June 12th

Laurel Horton will be our guest speaker with her topic on Early White Quilts and Counterpanes. She is internationally known for her research and writing on historic quilts including the award-winning book, "Mary Black's Family Quilts: Memory and Meaning in Everyday Life." She is also an imaginative fabric artist and inspiring teacher. She particularly enjoys experimenting with "string patchwork," a simple, traditional technique that lends itself to almost infinite variation. Laurel has made dozens of quilts for beds and walls. Since 2009 she has been making and selling "sPotholders TM", which are one-of-a-kind, decorative potholders designed as "original affordable fabric art." Laurel is a regular instructor at the John C.Campbell Folk School in Brasstown, NC, where her five-day "String Patchwork" class is designed to accommodate both beginners and intermediate quiltmakers. Laurel describes her class as a low-tech, low-stress way to "jumpstart" the design process.

Workshop on Friday June 13th - a half day workshop from 9:30 am to 1 pm. Laurel Horton's "String Piecing". This workshop is designed for relatively new quilters and for those experienced quilters willing to look at fabric with fresh eyes. Although the technique is simple, it provides opportunities for individual interpretation and exploration. The class fee is \$30.00 for members and \$40.00 for non-members. Sign up at the front desk at the April and May meetings to get a jump on this great class. A supply list will be provided upon sign up.

California guest speaker at Davie Quilt Guild

Pat Knoechel will present the program to the Davie Quilt Guild meeting on Monday, April 7, 2014. The meeting date and location have changed for this meeting. It will be held in the Family Life Center, First United Methodist Church, 310 N. Main Street. The meeting will begin at 7:00 p.m. Join us at 6:30 p.m. for a social time preceding the meeting.

Pat demonstrates a wide variety of quilt techniques: strip piecing, applique, scrap quilting, crazy quilts, paper piecing, piecing stars, triangles, and squares from her sister, Eleanor Burns, Quilt in a Day books.

This program will feature the newest publications from Quilt in a Day: Mystery Quilt (arriving Spring 2014) which includes patterns for Honeycomb, Christmas Tree & Wreath, Double Four Patch, Geese in the Garden, Pineapple, Nouveau Wedding Ring, Chimneys and Cornerstones quilt designs.
