Description of workshop: Fairies and Morning Glories 16


X 20. All skills levels.

October - pink

November - Thanksgiving

I'll also be passing along lots of tips and tricks of the trade, such as how to use fabric inks and fabric markers in quilted wall hangings....plus how to keep the edges of your fusing from fraying. I'll also be teaching several ways of finishing your wall hanging.....from facing to framing.....to mounting on a purchased canvas.

No drawing abilities needed. I will provide the pattern for Fairies and Morning Glories, but if you have picture or a pattern that you would like to do, that is okay, too. Bring your drawing or pattern. I'll be happy to help you with it.

# CHARITIES Being Considered as Silent Auction Partners for 2012 Show

**Greensboro Urban Ministry** provides crisis intervention and emergency services through the basics of food, shelter, and clothing, but also helps individuals and families break the cycles of poverty, hunger, addiction, and homelessness.

Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals of the Triad - "To protect, shelter and promote the adoption of homeless animals; to provide education about responsible pet ownership and to reduce pet overpopulation through spay/neuter programs."

Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwest NC - provides hunger-relief efforts for the region, helping to provide access to food to those who cannot afford it through its food distribution program.

LIFESPAN of Greensboro transforms the lives of children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities by providing education, employment, and enrichment opportunities that promote inclusion, choice, and family support.

Victory Junction Gang Camp - their mission is to enrich the lives of children with chronic medical conditions or serious illnesses by providing life-changing camping experiences that are fun in a safe and medically-sound environment.

Women's Resource Center - Their mission is to promote the self-reliance of women by assessing needs, providing services and acting as a gateway to community resources.

Guilford County Animal Shelter is operated by a non-profit organization, the United Animal Coalition, which is devoted to saving the lives of lost, abandoned and surrendered animals of Guilford County.

Sanctuary House provides those with a mental illness a chance to learn new skills, build confidence, gain a greater sense of independence and pride. Members do not live at Sanctuary House.

Hannah's Haven seeks to provide a safe, stable environment for women to establish a lifestyle free of drugs and alcohol who have recently completed substance abuse treatment or have undergone medically supervised detoxification.

HORSEPOWER Therapeutic Learning Center - their mission is to promote and enhance the welfare of individuals with disabilities by providing a program of therapeutic, educational and recreational value.

Autism Society of NC, Greensboro Chapter - ASNCGC is a charitable organization dedicated to providing support for Guilford County residents who are on the autism spectrum as well as their families, teachers, and caregivers.

Hospice of the Piedmont is a not-for-profit provider of palliative (comfort) care and support services for patients, their families and caregivers, mainly in the home, but also in nursing facilities, hospitals, and in the Hospice Home at High Point. Hospice of the Piedmont serves portions of Guilford, Forsyth, Randolph, and Davidson counties.

Humane Society of the Piedmont - Their mission is "With respect for all life, we will lead the community in efforts to eliminate animal cruelty and the tragedies of pet over-population through an aggressive spay and neuter program."

Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation - Piedmont Triad Chapter supports people with type 1 diabetes. Every year the Piedmont Triad Chapter sponsors events and initiatives to raise money for research.

Interactive Resource Center - The IRC assists people who are homeless, recently homeless or facing homelessness reconnect with their own lives and with the community at large.

Habitat for Humanity of Greater Greensboro is a Christian ministry that brings together people of all faiths to build quality, affordable homes and thriving neighborhoods where families can build better lives.

Girl Scouts - Carolina Peaks to Piedmont Council - Girl Scouting is designed to challenge and prepare girls for their future through three keys to leadership: discover, connect and take action.

Salvation Army of Greensboro administers many programs and services designed to restore broken lives, to build healthy relationships, and to develop and encourage people of all ages by offering a variety of programs such as character building, community-building and fellowship for adults, transitional housing, and addictions rehabilitation.
