#### **November Meeting**

We will be making quilted holiday ornaments at this meeting. If you did not attend last month's meeting here is the supply list of what you need to bring with you to the meeting to make the ornaments. This is a great stash buster and the pattern is FREE to all members and guests.

### Supplies list:

1 - 3" styrofoam ball (they come in packs of 6 - you can share with a friend or use them yourself.)

1 box of sequin straight pins (this will make 2 1/2 ornaments)

8 pcs - 2 1/2" squares of a light printed fabric

16 pcs - 2 1/2" squares of a solid dark fabric (or something that's nearly solid)

16 pcs - 2/1/2" squares of a medium toned print fabric

1 yard of a coordinating color ribbon - 3/4" wide

hot glue gun - optional for attaching ribbon to ornament

PLEASE HAVE ALL YOUR FABRICS PRE-CUT BEFORE THE MEETING! We will not have time to cut them before we start making the ornament.

There are three members who did not come to October's meeting to show their finished UFO project. Please bring your completed projects with you, if you have finished them, to the November meeting and now the spirits of Halloween past will haunt you to pay your fines for not completing your projects. We have your names and signed contracts - beware!
