Get them cut ahead and put them in your purse ready to go!

BLOCK of the MONTH - A surprise block to be shown at the meeting along with directions on how to make it. This will be the last in the 12 month series done by Jackie Russell. It's a fun way to show off new patterns for both experienced quilters and new members who are learning to quilt. It requires making one sample block per month and printing out the directions with simple drawings to make it, or you can choose to email the directions to members.

### **Holiday Market**

Holiday Market is coming! Only 90+ days until we plan to help our community with an opportunity for retail therapy, hopefully introduce our craft to others and still raise funds for our guild. Please be aware that we will need items in all types of price points. Smaller items such ornaments, towels, and bibs can generate a good cash flow from impulse buyers. Well-made and beautiful medium projects (I've seen your work at Show & Tell) such as table runners and toppers or wall hangings would have a higher ticket. Remember, you are setting the price on your items so not all table runners have to be priced the same. Of course we also hope to have quilts to offer, due to space constraints please consider staying in the smaller sizes - baby, lap or throw.

Consider your UFO stash as a starting point for getting a jump on your merchandise. Those of you that are like me, more piece-er than quilter could have quite a few projects ready with the motivation to sit down and quilt. Items do not have to limited to a specific "Holiday" theme, an embroidered or quilted apron does not have to only be for use in December.

Where ever your creativity is taking you, bring your projects, machines, supplies (please remember power strips) to our meeting on the 11th. We will be having a second "show and tell" at the end of our session focused just on the Market items we worked on in the meeting or those that you have already completed.

The Greensboro Historical Museum is sponsoring a quilt raffle to raise funds for its Adopt-an-Object program. Proceeds from the raffle will be used to restore or conserve items in the museum's collection. The raffle quilt is a bed-sized replica of a mid-19th century "Sunburst" quilt currently on display in the "Voices of a City" exhibit.
