Honey Buns = 1 ¹/₂-inch strips x WOF x 40 strips (all packaged together) WOF = width of fabric OSMG = old sewing machine guy (for repairs) RR = Round Robin Siggies = squares of fabric with signatures and often other information written on them WOMBAT = waste of money (or material), batting, and time EPP = English Paper Piecing
