We have a variety of charity quilt kits available, including kits from our 2018 Block of the Month blocks, so stop by the Community Outreach table at our meetings to choose your next project. -Carol DeSantis

Strip Club: The strip club theme for the month of February is **Polka Dots**. Strips should be 2 1/2 inches wide by width of fabric. Up to 3 strips per person per drawing. Contact Betty Green for any questions you may have.

Block of the Month: Each block will measure 12" square. We had so many blocks submitted for charity last year that we've been asked to make this year's blocks just for ourselves. All patterns can be found on http://www.quilterscache.com. There are options this time for each month. If you'd like a simpler, more straight-forward quilt using the same five fabrics and six easily pieced units for the whole quilt, choose the "Scrap Sampler Quilt." Please note that, although you can look up each of the individual "Scrap Sampler Quilt" block alphabetically by its name, you might want to at least get the total yardage for each of the five fabrics and see how many of each shape to cut by first searching for "Scrap Sampler Quilt." If, however, you're up for more of a challenge (i.e. either pieced, paper pieced, or appliqued), then choose one from the seasonal blocks. Blocks made from the "Scrap Sampler Quilt" will earn you \$100, whereas Seasonal blocks will earn you \$200 in Funny Money. I can't wait to see all your beautiful creations! Susan Lulham

January: "Clay's Choice" (Scrap Sampler Quilt), "Snowman Block" (Seasonal), "Snowball Nine Patch" (Seasonal)

February: "Mini Bow Ties" (Scrap Sampler Quilt), "Valentines" Note: This is an 8" block, so add border and/or sashing to make it 12" (Seasonal), "Card Trick" (Seasonal), "Log Cabin Variation" (Seasonal)
