FW = Featherweight, cute and collectible smaller sewing machine made by Singer from 1933 to 1969 GFG = Grandmother's Flower Garden, an English paper pieced quilt construction

HST = half square triangle, a versatile quilt block, lots of design possibilities, see group on Flickr.comNickel Squares = 5-inch squares of fabric, also known as Charm Squares, see*Nickel Quilts*books by Pat SpethQAYG = quilt as you go while constructing the quilt, rather than making the top completely first, thensandwiching the top, batting, and backing, then quilting
