Strip Club

More <u>stripes</u> for January, cut your strips 2 ½-inches by the width of the fabric, up to 3 strips per person for each drawing. We need someone to take over the Strip Club for 2018 if it is to continue.

Block of the Month

We start our new Block of the Month in January with a focus on Our Pioneer Heritage that will take us through the entire year of 2018. The block for January is Alaska Homestead and can be found at http://www.quilterscache.com/A/AlaskaHomesteadBlock.html where you can also read about the Homestead Act of 1862.

The guidelines for this year long BOM are simple: the blocks need to measure 10.5-inches after you sew your blocks and will be a finished 10-inch size when sewn into a guilt; you make one block each month for yourself

in any color way you choose and a you make a second block in scrappy fabrics that will go to our Community Outreach supply for future charity quilts. I will have a few printed copies of the current block available at each meeting and I will receive your Outreach blocks. If you'd like, please bring your personal block to show.
