It's almost spring and I am so ready for it. My yard has daffodils blooming everywhere. They are my reminder that life is beautiful. I hope you enjoyed the trunk show presented by last month by Lisa Alley. Her stories of her quilting adventures were very interesting.

As you learned from our last newsletter I enjoy searching computer websites like Pinterest for ideas and inspiration. In January I found a little 6" block that I loved so of course I saved it and then went to the website where it came from and discovered something special, "The Splendid Sampler." (TheSplendidSampler.com). This is a website for a sampler quilt that challenges every participant to try new techniques on a weekly basis using small 6" blocks. In February, 2016 Nationally known quilter and teacher Pat Sloan from Virginia and her friend Jane Davidson from Australia combined their talents and enlisted the help of many other nationally known quilters to design 100 blocks. They offered 2 patterns a week for free. The techniques include: piecing (of course), embroidery, paper piecing, English paper piecing, applique. Quilters were urged to complete their blocks and then post pictures of their block to the website. The response was amazing! Over 25,000 quilters from around the world participated. The free pattern download has ended but the is a book coming out in April of this year with the patterns. I urge you to look at their website and be inspired. They also have a Facebook page where quilters are posting photos of their blocks and finished quilts.

A quilting tip: when Mary Vick, a quilter from Nebraska, finishes a quilt she makes a pillowcase or bag from the scraps of the quilt to store the quilt in. It also serves as wrapping if the quilt is a gift.

Piedmont Quilters' Guild Challenge

Create a Medallion Quilt – one center motif with multiple borders, embellishments, decorative items; creativity is encouraged!

Due: June Meeting

Rules:

The Challenge entry must be a total measurement of <u>less than 100 inches in circumference</u>; there is no minimum size requirement. The entry may be a mini-quilt, wall hanging, doll quilt, mug rug, small table topper or runner. It must be made by one person only. The entry must include a top, batting and backing, and be quilted or tied together. Pin your name and phone number on a folded piece of paper on the back of the quilt for purposes of registration. You may name your quilt and pin that on the front of the quilt to be seen during judging. Turn your quilt in 'incognito' at the entry to the meeting (a sign will direct you) as judging needs to be anonymous!

During the meeting the entries will be laid out for display. Each guild member present will receive three voting chits and will place those chits in the voting box of their three favorite entries. Members are NOT required to use all chits – they may be turned in at the end of the voting.

First, 2nd, and 3rd place will be announced by the end of the meeting based on the number of votes. Prizes are:

First Place: \$3000 quilt money Second Place: \$2000 quilt money Third Place: \$1000 quilt money All other entries receive \$500 quilt money
