Future Programs and Workshops

April 12, 2018 - Beverly Clement – Trunk show & fabric sale - Beverly has many quilts and other exciting items constructed from quilt fabric to show us. Fabric is also being brought for purchase. Bring a list of your fabric needs, you may just find it here.

April 14, 2018 - Beverly Clement – Workshop, April 14, Starmount Church Fellowship Hall, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. The cost for members will be \$25.00. She has given us several choices to choose from (some will include kits at an extra charge). Please see Mary Jo at our March meeting to help pick the one we want and to sign up for the class.

May 10, 2018 - Michele J Linder, author of "Square Magic" will show us how to start with a quilt square and create magical block units. These magic squares are addictive! Michelle's wonderful way with squares yields dozens of variations and sizes that the newest quilter can use to create hundreds of beautiful blocks.

June 14, 2018 - Karen Stockwell, Fiber Artist will present "Round Robins", that share your skills, your ideas, creativity and part of yourselves with other quilting friends. A Round Robin is a great way to challenge yourself to reach beyond the way you've always done things. This lecture and trunk show will explain the process.

June 15, 2018 - Karen Stockwell - Class/Workshop, Deconstructed Wedding Rings - The Double Wedding Ring can be surprisingly versatile. What happens if you make the rings different sizes, and don't join them? How about adding some other elements? Let's play with modernizing an old favorite. And with a white or solid background, it can easily be a modern quilt. A 36" x 39" pattern required for the class is \$10 (included in the class fee) and contains full sized templates and directions for 3 different finishing techniques. Good for all skill levels. Sign up for 20 participants, our members only, will be available through Thursday, April 12 and the cost for members will be \$45. After April 12, we will open the class to members of other guilds. We will also be charging a \$5 admittance fee to non-members for Karen's presentation, on June 14, 2018.

The guidelines for this year long BOM are simple: the blocks need to measure a finished 10-inch size, you make one block each month for yourself in any colors you choose and a you make a second block in scrappy fabrics that will go to our Community Outreach supply for future donation quilts.
