MAY PROGRAM: May's program will be presented by Priti Kumar. She will speak on quilting in India and guild members will be able to create a small block following her technique. This will be a mini workshop during our meeting. **Note from Priti:** The technique that I will demonstrate will require 3 to 5 layers of lightweight fabric squares of same size and a lace (or something similar) to finish the raw edges of the work. Tools: Needle, thread, ruler, scissors and tailoring chalk (or quilt marking chalk) to mark fabric. Squares of fabric can be 6 to 8 inches square - your choice. We will be learning the quilting technique traditional in India. Don't miss this wonderful opportunity. See you at the meeting.

PRESIDENT'S NOTE: Breaking Out of the Box Are you stuck in the same old rut? Doing the same patterns time and time again? Passing on classes that would teach you techniques or patterns – secretly scared to try something new? Well, it is time to break out of your box and have some fun!! Quilting is a wonderfully creative medium. Our quilts do not have to be complicated to be beautiful. Simple quilts, like the traditional Amish quilts, are beautiful and, yet, they use a very limited selection of fabrics. Choices in colors and fabrics can change a quilt pattern or design instantly. Taking a twist on a traditional block has led to the happy creation of lots of the patterns we see in the quilt shops today. As you may know, I am chair of the Quilt Show Challenge. I have always wanted to do the Challenge because trying to make a quilt with limitations can really spark your creativity! So here is your chance!

The Challenge info....I will be bringing handouts of the rules to the meeting....i will also be bringing pictures of examples...

Quilt Show Challenge 2020, Every Day is a Celebration!

Choosing your Special Celebration:

- 1. Draw from the Month bag.
- 2. Then draw from the Date bag.

- 3. Look on the Calendar for your specific Month and Date.
- 4. Choose one of the special celebrations listed in **red** or **blue**.
 - a. Celebrations listed in black are not eligible.
 - b. If your specific Date has only one Celebration, then you may choose a second date.This is one time only.
- 5. You will sign the Calendar on your date and circle your chosen Celebration.
- 6. Once each month has been chosen, we will start over with all 12 months.
- 7. On any following rounds of months if the date you have drawn has already been chosen, you will be allowed to choose again.

Rules for the Challenge Quilt:

- 1. This is your interpretation of your Special Celebration!
- 2. The quilt must measure 15" wide by 25" high.
- 3. Your Special Day must be visible on the front side of the quilt. This includes the Month, Date, and the name of the Celebration.
- 4. Each quilt top must include a *minimum* of 4 **traditional pieced** quilt blocks at least 2 inches square finished and no more than 5 inches square finished.
- 5. Binding must be in a solid color fabric.
- 6. Embellishments are encouraged.
- 7. Any form of applique is allowed.
- 8. This is a quilt so it must be 3 layers, and must be quilted.

Please use a separate line for each item. I am happy to pull out another sign up sheet if our members fill up the first page. Sign it in as usual...and then display your quilt where you are sitting so others can see it up close before the meeting starts. It's a great chance to share your work and get ideas from each other.

MINI CHALLENGE QUILT from 2018: Time has been extended to the September, 2019 meeting. It is small. You have time to do it. Here are the rules: Get 3-4 fabrics equalling approximately 3 fat quarters from SOMEONE ELSE'S STASH. Add one fabric, add one selvage, add one piece of ribbon. Use some of all on the front of the guilt. You are on your own for backing and binding.
