We will be looking at color usage, design inspiration and construction techniques. Most of the brilliantly colored blocks that will be shown were hand sewn by Kuna Indians of the San Blas islands in Panama, others are Patti's own designs.

We enjoyed assisting the children who were making memory bears for someone they lost. Cathy Lohr, director of Volunteer services sent us a thank you note.

We delivered 22 tote bags to the Interactive Resource Center after our August meeting. The bags were laid out for the clients to select from and they were thrilled. The bags were gone in minutes and there was lots of modeling and comparing. Obviously there is a great need.

During August Sit and Sew we worked on more charity quilt kits. Check out our table at future meetings.

There will be no Sit and Sew in September as we have a workshop scheduled. In October we have scheduled a "Let's make a Difference day" of sewing on Saturday, October 20, 10 AM to 4 PM, at Gate City Baptist Church, 5350 Hilltop Rd, Jamestown, NC. This is Ann Johnson's church where we had the quilt judging last year so we know there is room for all of us. We will work on:

- 1. Homeless Totes: all materials cut and labeled, help available if this is your first tote
- 2. Fleece hats for cancer patients all materials provided and cut
- 3. Charity quilts kits and fabric will be available
- 4. Dog and cat beds bring your left over scraps, we will have beds sewn and ready to fill Please mark your calendar. Bring your machine and basic sewing tools. Or, just come and we'll have a job for you ironing, cutting, hand sewing, etc. And, bring a friend!
