Upcoming Meetings:

July Meeting: PQG Annual Summer Picnic and OPEN HOUSE! Something new we are trying this year. Tables will be set up at the far end of the room for you to put them on. Let's make this a great time for all and a chance to show off our talents and boost our guild members!

August Meeting: What everyone has been asking for! We are starting our block of the month program. August will bring a red and white 16"x16" Hunter's Star Block done in the easy construction method. We will be making this block at our regular meeting after all the announcements, so bring your sewing machines and sewing tools/notions to make the block at the meeting. A supply list will be at the Programs and Workshops table at the July meeting. If you have scraps and fat quarters in your stash, now's your chance to get to use some of them up. If you are going to make a 2 color block, you only need 2 fat quarters to make this. And if members want to donate a block, we can put them together to make a lap quilt and donate it to charity. The instruction sheet and pattern are free to members and \$10.00 to non-members. If you know anyone from another guild who would like to join us - please ask them - the more the merrier!

We will also have scissor sharpening at this meeting - so bring your knives and scissors with you. Prices range from \$4 to \$7 for the sharpening.

August Road Trip! Friday, August 14, from 10 - 3 will be our field trip to Spoonflower and a Quilt Shop Hop, with lunch in between. Please sign up before the middle of July so we can get a head count and plan the lunch spot. Mary Ann Rhodes is in charge of the trip. Barn Quilts Workshop! August will also be the month we will do the 4' x 4' Barn Quilt project. We will be doing the project on the grounds of Lee's Chapel Presbyterian Church, on Lee's Chapel Road in Greensboro. Members will be responsible for the purchase and prep of the plywood and getting it to and from the workshop. Supply lists and prep instructions will be provided at the June meeting. Jackie Russell will teach the class. Fee is \$20.00 for members and \$30.00 for non-members. Because this project must be done outdoors, there will be a rain date. Final plans are being made and a date for the workshop will be announced at the June meeting. Members who have signed up to do the 2'x2' size will also be attending this workshop.

Guild Activities and Opportunities:

Community Outreach will be meeting at Ye Olde Forest Quilt Shop the first Monday of each month between 1pm and 5pm. We will be sewing on projects for the various charities PQG supports. Please feel free to bring your own future charity quilt or try new projects planned for the session.

At the initial session on Monday, June 1st, we will be making a scrappy, strippy quilt which starts out like the Jelly Roll Race quilt. You will need 20 to 40 (depending on your final size) WOF 2.5 inch strips in your scrappy colors. Those strips will be cut in half (about 20 inches in length) before you join them. You will need 1.5 to 3 yards of your contrasting solid/tone-ontone. The wide range is due to size, border and binding options.

Please bring all necessary sewing supplies and your machine. Kelley and Joanne are letting us use the classroom area at Ye Olde Forest. The shop is located at 3005 South Elm-Eugene Street in Greensboro.

Patti says the only thing she didn't learn was the word for seam ripper....the teacher would go on and on in French, and if Patti didn't understand, the teacher would then switch to English and say "just rip it out!"

She has taken many other classes since she's been back in the states from the local shops and through our guild. She enjoys learning new things and getting a fresh look at things she already knows how to do. She also likes our Show and Tell portion of the guild meetings to see what talent our members have and also for inspiration.

Patti is a topper - she loves to make the quilt tops, but does not enjoy the process of finishing a quilt after that. For every large project she does, there is a charity quilt made out of the scraps.

Patti's favorite quilt is the one on her bed right now. It is an Egyptian themed quilt with matching pillow shams. It is her favorite period of history and she finds it very interesting.

Currently she is working on a rainbow boutique project. In a weak moment she bought the 30+ different fabrics back when Randy had his shop, and has all the pieces cut and bagged, ready to go.
