September Meeting:

Our guest speaker will be Sandy Fitzpatrick from Hissyfitz. Sandy is a well-known designer and quilter with many of her patterns in local quilt shops and online. Her presentation will be "Why Didn't I Think of That? Tips and Tricks for Sewing Short-cuts." Sandy is very knowledgeable about the ins and outs of sewing so this lecture should prove to be very interesting. Got a sewing problem? Sandy will be happy to answer your questions after her lecture. She will also have a trunk show of some of her most popular works.

Block of the month will be "The 10 minute Block" by Suzanne McNeil. Elsie Hutchens will show an almost finished quilt with this block and explain how it's made: five - 10" squares and only three seams per block - a quilter's paradise. It's a great block for a very quick quilt - you can make and finish the quilt in one day. Actual time making 6 blocks for the quilt top is 1 hour! So if you need a quick quilt - this is the one you want and it's so pretty when it's finished.
