Our August speaker is Neva Hart, an AQS certified appraiser. The program will be on "HOW TO ADD VALUE TO TODAY'S QUILTS." Neva will discuss what today's quilters can do to make their art tomorrow's heirlooms. Neva's programs are always so fun and informative!

#### APPRAISALS OFFERED AT OUR QUILT SHOW

Members of our guild will have the opportunity to have their quilts (old and new) and coverlets appraised by Neva Hart, an AQS certified appraiser. Neva will be at our quilt show on Saturday, September 22nd during our show hours. If you would like a written appraisal for a quilt that you've made and is hanging in the show please let Michelle Owens know. If at least five hanging quilts require written appraisals Neva will come in on Friday to do those written appraisals. You can let me know if you'll have any need for verbal appraisals also. I'll need to know by Thursday, September 13th (our regular monthly guild meeting) so you've got time to think about it and I'll remind you again as we get closer to the show.

#### Appraisal fees:

- \* Written appraisal (includes value, photo and documentation) \$50 each, 10% discount after the first quilt per owner for additional quilts (5% of the fee goes back to the guild) --- Why get a written appraisal? Written appraisals are used for insurance, tax deductions, donations, estate valuations, shipping to shows & exhibits and gifting.
- \* **Verbal appraisal** \$15 each (\$5 of the fee goes back to the guild)

#### Cotton Theory Quilting: PLACEMAT WORKSHOP

Please join us on **September 14<sup>th</sup>** for a **Cotton Theory Quilting Placemat workshop!** What is cotton Theory Quilting? Cotton Theory Quilting is a new and different way to construct your quilt. It's backward! Unlike traditional quilts, which are pieced together, layered with batting and then quilted, Cotton Theory projects are quilted first, one segment at a time and then assembled using Betty Cotton's fold-and-finish procedures. Karla Singer is a certified Cotton Theory Quilting instructor. She will teach us how to make placemats using Cotton Theory Quilting techniques. A supply list and cutting instructions will be provided to attendees in advance.

The workshop will be held from 9:00 to 5:00 in the fellowship hall of the **Presbyterian Church of the Covenant** (501 South Mendenhall Street, Greensboro). Bring your bag lunch or plan to run out and pick something up. To help with the lighting and outlet situation in the fellowship hall, please bring a long extension cord and an Ott light if you have one. Be sure to write your name on these.

The cost will be \$20.00 for members and \$30.00 for nonmembers. The book for the class is \$14.00 and you can purchase these from Karla at the beginning of the workshop. Karla will provide the batting for the project. An invitation will be extended to other guilds to take this workshop so please sign up quickly to reserve your spot. There is a maximum of 20 people for this class.

#### Summer Cleaning of the Storage Unit

It has come to our attention that we have lots and lots of donated fabric for Community Outreach stored in the guild's storage unit. Nancy did the math and we now see how much money the guild is spending to hold on to that fabric and our other guild items. We want to downsize to a smaller storage unit to hold the quilt show rack feet (we have arranged other storage for the poles), quilt show signs, guild historical items and such. At the August meeting we will bring over 20 boxes of fabric to the church. We ask you go through this fabric with plans in mind to make something for the guild. Most of this fabric is quilting cotton or flannel. You may take fabric to make a Project Linus quilt, a Veterans shelter quilt, an outfit for Newborns in Need, a Make a Difference Day project or you can even make something quickly to sell in the quilt show boutique. Do not stop making your quilt show entry to work on this!!! You have a whole year to make something with this fabric...we just need to get rid of it now. Any fabric left over will be sold at the quilt show or donated to other groups. You won't see this fabric again so please take as much as you can now! We appreciate your help!

#### Make a Difference Day 2012

I just wanted to remind you that our guild will be participating in MAKE A DIFFERENCE DAY again this year. Please see Michelle Owens or look on the website (on the Service Work tab) for a list of projects we will be working on throughout the year and on **Saturday, October 27th**. We will be work on our guild's Make a Difference Day projects in the church's **Fellowship Hall** from **10am to 4pm...**come for a few hours or come for the whole day!

Some fabric, kits and patterns will be available at each meeting for you to take and work on at home. We have  $\underline{\text{tons}}$  of polar fleece stored at the church for Chemo hats! To reduce cost to the guild we will not be printing instructions for many of the projects but will be happy to email them to you. Please let Michelle know which patterns/instructions you would like her to email to you.

\*\* Important note about stockings for Operation Shoebox: Gerry Chase has informed me that the size for the stocking has been changed. It is now larger to hold more stuff! If you are thinking of cutting out any stockings, please see the website for the revised pattern. Gerry has said she will accept your Christmas, Hanukkah and Winter fabrics if you would like to bring them to her at the guild meeting.

Are you interested in being the chairperson for Make A Difference Day 2013? Cheryl Joines and I are looking for a few guild members to take over this committee next year. If you would like to chair this committee in 2013 please let us know. Working with us as we make final preparations for the 2012 event is the best way to see what we do!

#### Preparing your Entry for the Show

#### Making a Hanging Sleeve


Cut (or piece fabric together to form) a strip of fabric  $10 \ 1/2$  to 11 inches wide and long enough to extend across the top of your entry.

Make a tube by sewing the long sides of the strip together. Your tube should measure 5 inches wide by long enough to extend across the top of your entry.



Attach the tube to the top of your entry just below the binding. Sew along the long sides of the tube (top and bottom) so that it is not loose and a hanging rod can be inserted for hanging.

#### Identifying your entry

Write your name, address, and guild on the back of your entry. If you do not want to write on the entry, write on the sleeve or on a piece of muslin which you attach to the entry.
