AUGUST WORKSHOP - Back by popular demand! Teresa Rouzer will teach a Scrappy Quilt Block workshop on Saturday, August 3rd from 9am to 3pm. Teresa plans to teach at least eight scrap blocks/techniques including a two-piece Prairie Point and maybe a quick craft or two. I took her class a few years back and I learned so much!!!

- 6. Embellishments are not required, but encouraged.
- 7. Quilted not tied, 3 layers, backing, batting & top
- 8. Made entirely by one person
- 9. Please complete by July 2014 meeting for program and chance for prizes.

No Entry fee, no photo required, quilt label on back same as required by the show. No sleeve required.
