JUNE PROGRAM SNEAK PEEK: Have you always wanted to paint a BARN QUILT BLOCK but been afraid to tackle a large piece of plywood? Then this is perfect for you! Lisa Martin, a Patrick County, Virginia, native and owner of The Wormy Chestnut, will be the guest speaker for our June 8 meeting. Lisa was instrumental in creating the Patrick County Barn Quilt Trail and has been hosting and teaching barn quilt classes for years. Besides talking about the history and nature of barn quilts, she will be bringing a mini patriotic barn quilt ornament project for the group to complete.

In addition, she will have 12" x 12" Barn Quilt Kits available for purchase for \$30 each if anyone is interested. She'll be bringing a variety of popular designs and the kits contain the stenciled barn quilt, paints, brushes, and instructions for completion. These small kits are perfect to decorate a mailbox or house sign, to frame and show off in your house, or to adorn a porch or other outdoor setting. Please bring cash or a check to purchase any kits.

Lisa will also offer a **BARN QUILT BLOCK** workshop if members are interested. The cost is \$40 per person, but that includes everything - and she even brings extra cups so if someone doesn't finish, they can take them home. People can pay her the day of the class. IMPORTANT SAFETY RECALL NOTICE -

CONSUMER NOTIFICATION

(Model Nos. SF-717, SF-720, or SF-727) manufactured between 2008 and March 2017

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission ("CPSC") and Health Canada, Vornado is voluntarily recalling certain dual voltage Steamfast brand Home and Away Steam Irons manufactured between 2008 and March 2017 and Brookstone brand Steam Bug Travel Irons manufactured between 2008 and 2013, because the power cord can become damaged near the cord bushing, which can lead to overheating of the cord, posing fire and burn hazards. In addition, cord damage near the bushing can result in exposed copper wires, posing a shock hazard. All dual voltage Steamfast Home and Away Steam Irons and Brookstone Steam Bug Travel Steam Irons produced between January 2008 and March 2017 are recalled. Units produced after March 2017 are not affected by this recall.

If you have a recalled iron, please stop use immediately and contact Vornado to participate in the recall and obtain a refund of \$19.99. The brand, model number, production date code, and ETL mark are printed on a rating label on the bottom of the unit, as shown below. The model number and production date code locations are shown in the red boxes on the rating labels below.
