### **SUPPORT GREENSBORO HISTORICAL MUSEUM**

The Greensboro Historical Museum is sponsoring a quilt raffle to raise funds for its Adopt-an-Object program. Proceeds from the raffle will be used to restore or conserve items in the museum's collection. The raffle quilt is a bed-sized replica of a mid-19th century "Sunburst" quilt currently on display in the "Voices of a City" exhibit. It was made by Piedmont Quilters' Guild member Dawn Kouba and quilted by Gina Boone. The winning ticket will be drawn at the museum foundation's annual meeting on November 1, 2016.

Tickets are \$1.00 each or 6 tickets for \$5.00. They may be purchased in person at the museum gift shop located at 130 Summit Avenue in Greensboro (museum hours Tuesday-Saturday 10 AM to 5 PM; Sunday 2 PM to 5 PM; closed Mondays) or over the phone with a credit card (336-373-2949).
