## **Community Outreach**

“Hat-er-day” - Part of Make a Difference Day 2015 Saturday, October 24, from 10 am to 4 pm  
Where: First Lutheran Church, 3600 W. Friendly Avenue (Corner of W. Friendly and N. Holden) – Use the main entrance and look for the signs, we'll be in the classroom area. We will be making fleece hats and no-sew fleece throws for chemo patients. Come for a few hours or stay for the whole day. We need volunteers with sewing machines, but we'll also need volunteers to do handwork for the hats if you don't want to bring your machine. We also need help clipping and tying the no-sew fleece throws.

Bring: Sewing Machine , basic sewing supplies - scissors, neutral thread, pins, and needles, extension cord/power strip (be sure to put your name on it), bag lunch.

\*OPTIONAL - Fleece! I have fleece for the hats so you don't have to purchase any, but you can bring any you may have left over from another project. We do need two coordinating pieces of fleece yardage (1-1/2 or 2 yards each) for the fleece throws. Please keep in mind while shopping that these hats and throws are mainly for adult patients. For hat decorations: I have precut felt flowers and buttons for decorating the hats; please feel free to bring any decorations you may have on hand.
